# ALPHONSA COLLEGE, PALA ANNUAL REPORT 2020-21

# STRENGTH

The college has at present 1851 students on its rolls, 223 students in the 7 PG sections and 1628 students in 13 UG courses. The college also offers 7 Add-On courses which can be pursued along with the regular courses. The Alphonsa Institute of Computer Studies has separate enrolments for various certificate and diploma courses.

It is a matter of pride that that we have started another aided PG course sanctioned by the Government of Kerala: M. A. Econometrics. Alphonsa College Pala has been approved with the following Certificate and Diploma Courses under the NSQF scheme by UGC:

- 1. Certificate course in Health Economics and Palliative Care
- 2. Certificate course in Language Enhancement for Professionals: Technology for Linguistics Perfection
- 3. Diploma in Women Entrepreneurship Development and Small Industries

The staff of our College consistof 39 permanent teaching staff, 29 teachers in the self-financing wing and 15 guest lecturers. At present the college has 26 non-teaching staff. The faculty and students of the college continue their pursuit of quality in academic and research activities.

Our students performed excellently well in the M. G.University examinations of May 2020 securing **10** ranks and  $96A^+$  grade. Our results were well above the University average. The rank holders of our College are:

# **HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR**

Even in the face adversities and struggles in this academic year caused by the Covid 19 pandemic, our students performed well to accomplish their goals. I would like to applaud the teamwork of the teaching and non-teaching staff community of the College, the committed and collaborating efforts of the students in the online and virtual method of teaching-learning process. I am extremely thankful to the management for the profound support in this difficult time.

I am very happy to announce that we have been selected as a Member of National Rural Entrepreneurship Mission, carried out by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India. **RUSA**- Our College was selected as one of the beneficiaries under RUSA 2.0 on 2018. Fund was allocated for construction (Open Auditorium cum Volley ball court), renovation and purchase (purchase sophisticated equipment for improving IT infrastructure, strengthening library and setting up of research oriented laboratories in all the Science departments) with a total outlay of Rs. 2 crores including the centage and GST charges. Kerala State Nirmithi Kendra (KESNIK) regional office Pala has been agreed to render civil works under this scheme as Project Management Consultant (PMC).

Out of Rs. 2 crores, a total of one crore rupees was received till date. The renovation works such as flooring of classrooms and laboratories (Chemistry core and complementary lab, Physics core, complementary and research lab, Biochemistry lab, Botany core lab, Zoology UG, and PG lab), improvisation of work table and remodeling (of Chemistry core and complementary lab, Biochemistry lab, Zoology PG lab, and Physics research laboratories), renovation and modernisation of college canteen, plastering of walls and painting was completed. Construction works are in progress. Foundation and pillar works were completed.

NCC-The College won this year the title of "*Best NCC subunit in Five Kerala Girls Battalion*". Our students U/O Binipria Babu, U/O Liya Sunny, CPL Jyothi Roy and LCPL Devika M.Nair attended various online EBSB camps. Cadet Aswathy Manoharan attended National Nilgiri Trekking Expedition, 73 cadets attended Annual NCC cadre this year. The NCC cadets of the sub unit actively participated in the Fit India Campaign launched by the Prime Minister. As part of the campaign the sub unit conducted webinar series on "Health And Physical Fitness", "Essentials of Disciplined Physique", "Fitness And Dietary Habits", "Physique and Physical Fitness". Along with all these, the cadets also *produced a short film "ECHO"* on the theme Fit India Young India.

Under the captaincy of Kum. Vigina K.B, our College team won the first position National Federation Cup Volleyball Championship held in Senior at Bhuvaneshwar. Our students won the Kerala state Cross-Country Championship and participated the National Cross-CountryChampionship. During this online period many of our students participated and won various competitions on online platform. Kum. Lisbeth Caroline Joseph of III DC English got selection to Virgin Liberty University with afull scholarship of 1.64 Crores. Kum.Riyamol Joy &Aswathy Binu won the Gold & Silver medals in Kerala State Senior Athletic Championship held at Calicut on 17th February 2021.Kum. Riyamol&Emily won Silver and Bronze medals in 400m at Senior State Meet at Calicut on 17th February 2021.Kum.Akhila M R won the Silver Medal in 5000m. She is selected to represent Kerala in National Cross-Country championship which will be held at Chandighad. I take this opportunity to congratulate all of them for their brilliant and commendable performance that bring honour to the College.

During the pandemic period a good number of our teachers attended different workshops, FDPs and got their works published in various international and national journals. All the departments have subject associations which organize a number of activities for their members and motivate the students to participate in intercollegiate competitions. Most of the departments organized programmes, competitions and exhibitions and also participated in several intercollegiate competitions. Soft skill development programmes are also initiated by various subject associations; they also carry out extension activities in nearby institutions.

IQAC of the College organized a *three-days online Faculty Development Programme on E-Connect, E- Learning and E-Content tools* for the teachers on 25<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> May 2020.
